



21st Century eSchool 2011-12 Fact Sheet

- Offers courses for students in grades K-12:
 - K-8 students must take at least four courses online.
 - 9-12 students who are district residents have option of full-time or part-time online (up to two classes online or two classes in the building).
- Full-time online students can take up to two classes at a “brick and mortar” school in the district.
- MCPASD residents can apply and switch their enrollment at anytime (though the natural breaks in the school year are recommended and at the high school level may be required). Non-district residents must apply through the open enrollment process in February.
- All students receive a laptop if they would like one, students in the K-12 program also receive a printer.
- Students who have an IEP can receive necessary services through MCPASD special education staff in the buildings as necessary.
- High school students have the option of asynchronous courses through the Wisconsin eSchool Network or synchronous courses through the K-12 program and through VHS courses that are part of the Wisconsin eSchool Network.
- Students are allowed to participate in sports and extracurricular activities offered through MCPASD if they meet WIAA eligibility standards.
- We are currently in our second year with enrollment at 77 full-time students. Of those students, 42 are district residents, 35 are open-enrolled.
- * We have 48 K-8 students and 29 high school students
